It is with deep gratitude and a renewed sense of purpose that I write to you regarding the sale of the property at 35 Henman Close, Swindon, UK, which has served the Diocese faithfully for several years. As we take this step forward, I wish to express my heartfelt appreciation for the tireless efforts, sacrifices, and selfless contributions of so many who made the acquisition and sustenance of this property possible.

A Debt of Gratitude

First and foremost, we thank God for the unwavering love, care, hard work, and prayers of His Grace Dr. Mathews Mar Thimothios Metropolitan, whose dedication was a driving force behind the acquisition of this property in 2015.

- ◆ The Trustees of the Property, from the time of its purchase until today, for their responsibility and stewardship.

- 2. The Diocese should establish, in a feasible location, a larger centre to serve the growing needs of our faithful.

To this end, the 'Building Search Committee' and the Council have jointly begun working towards materialising this vision.

To those who have Direct Debits currently active for the Swindon Property, I extend my sincere gratitude for your generosity. At the same time, I humbly request you to continue supporting the Diocese, as we move forward in faith.
